

Example of How to Read the Line up/Roll Sheet

Each volunteer has different needs. The actual Line up/Roll Sheet you receive might have subtle differences than what is projected here.

A # with "First" after it means that this is the first number that this student is in.

Tells Dressing Room A Volunteer (Table) which table the student is sitting at

Tells Runners what side this student exits to, and what dressing room to take this student to when their number is done

Check to make sure your students have the correct colour of costume, tights, shoes and hair.

Tells Gym Table Volunteers which table(s) they are covering

Means this student was in a previous number and will be joining the rest of the class later.

Tells what dressing room a student will be found in. A "Q" means this student has a quick change from their previous # and will be in the quick-change area. An "S" means that the student is already up on stage. "ABC" denote Dressing Rooms

This tells the Runners that this student enters on Stage Right on the front line (A). The "2" indicates that she is 2nd in line going on.

This is the next dance the student is in. Help them into their next costume. "Done" means that this is the student's last number and they can begin preparing for finale (keep last costume on).

The items above tell you what the student has to get into for their next number. Please get them ready for this next number
